Science Teacher News:

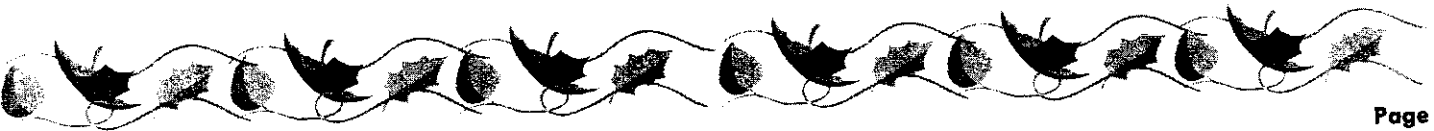
